Concerning my question to the possibilities of having some samples of radiocar bon from N.W. Argentina, I believe was a misunders tanding, due to my poor management of English.

- differents sites belonging to the archaeological sequence of N. W. Argentina.
 - 2. As all the CI4 laboratories in the States has plenty of geological and archaeological samples to be checked, I thought that it will be easier if I send only two or these samples to each laboratories. Is very doubfoull than any one

will take as many as II samples, as is that could be the case, it will take longer than summiting the samples to several laboratories.

The last procedure if what I have adopted.

3. In no case the samples that I will send to your laboratory will be reduplication of samples allready checked.

I plan to go back to Argentina next
March, so to me will be good enoghu if I can have
the samples checked for that time, and I really
will apreacide any possibility of doing so.

As I have only three samples left, I think with those I will be able to complete a firt radiocarbon checking of my sequence.
